Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of St Mary's,

### St Mary's Christmas Fair

### **Attendance**

St Mary's is dedicated to supporting strong attendance for all children so that they receive an excellent education. The benefits of being in school are numerous and we know children are at a disadvantage when they miss out on lessons. We would ask all parents to follow the steps below.

#### What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival. We will always call if we feel your child is struggling in school.

Have a backup plan for if you are unable to bring your child to school, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help! Please speak with Mrs Bain our Family Support Worker or Mrs Tainsh.

### What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

Members of the Attendance Action Alliance have worked with the Department for Education to develop this short guide which helps parents understand how they can work with their school and local authority to support their children to attend school and get the right support.

We promise we will always phone parents if children are too unwell to be in school.

We have also recently seen a rise in the number of requests to leave early at the end of the day. Again, this is disruptive to your child's learning and would request that you avoid making these requests.

# **Acting with respect**

It is with a heavy heart and sadness that I write to you about this. As a general rule, schools are orderly, safe places, where relationships between staff and visitors, especially parents/carers, demonstrate mutual respect and recognition of shared responsibility for pupils' welfare and educational progress. Parental involvement is an important factor in educational success and in dealing with emerging problems at an early stage.

However, on occasion, the behaviour of a few parents/carers has caused severe anxiety and upset due to inappropriate and often confrontational calls, emails, meetings with staff. This is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. We have even had an incident when a parent was shouting so much on the phone to office staff, that staff just passing through the office, heard the conversation.

No staff member intentionally upsets a parent/carer and I would ask that you remember this. We know it is a minority of parents, but the numbers are growing.

If an incident happens in the class, you need to address this firstly with the class teacher. Other staff and office staff will not necessarily know what has happened and they are not best placed to deal with your concerns. If you are not satisfied with the response from the class teacher, you then involve senior leaders – Mr Davies or myself.

We really do want to work with each one of you and we do appreciate your support. Our primary focus has to be the Teaching and Learning of all pupils.

Last year our uptake on after school clubs was disappointing. We are currently also looking at running clubs in the lunch hour too so that children have several options.
