

World Book Day 2018

St Mary's enjoyed another successful World Book Day focused around bedtime stories. The children came to school dressed in their pyjamas while the staff dressed up as Roald Dahl characters.



The day began with an assembly where the children had the opportunity to 'hot seat' a number of characters.



Each class chose a favourite Roald Dahl book to concentrate on and participated in activities around the story culminating in a piece of artwork for display.

Key Stage 1 chose 'Revoltig Rhymes' by Roald Dahl.

Reception enjoyed Jack & the Beanstalk and planted their own bean. The children all helped to produce a piece of art that was a scene from the story.



Reception Year 1 read Little Red Riding Hood from Roald Dahl's book of Revoltig Rhymes. The children acted out the story in the hall using masks and a 'wolf skin' coat. They made lots of rhymes and built houses that would stop a wolf.



Year 1 & 2 focused on 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and couldn't believe how naughty Goldilocks was and discussed her many crimes.

Year 2 read The Three Little Pigs.



Year 3 enjoyed 'Esio Trot' by Roald Dahl.



Year 4 - We had a fun day reading parts of the Roald Dahl story The BFG and looked at the words used by the BFG to describe things like snozzcumbers, ucky mucky, icky poo, whizzpopping and discussed the meaning of some of the words.

We chose a word to write and decorated them for effect.

We enjoyed making snozzcumbers with cucumber, tuna, poppy seeds and popcorn and some of us were even brave enough to taste them!

We drafted and wrote our own dreams to ensure they had a beginning, middle and an end using adjectives to describe characters and settings- We used these to fill dream jars, just like in the story.

We all enjoyed using watercolours to paint a picture of the BFG and Sophie for display.
